Putting Plans into Action

A wide variety of temporary or semipermanent pilot projects can be employed affordably to demonstrate proof-of-concept for longer-term and more comprehensive efforts to improve walkability. Many of these have in recent years been collected under the heading of "tactical urbanism." Since these projects often rely heavily on the physical participation of area residents, they often have the added benefit of building trust between the citizenry and the public sector through active side-by-side engagement.





If a pilot project proves popular and feasible, it can be made more permanent and expanded. If it proves unpopular, or fails for some other reason, the lesson has been learned inexpensively, before a deeper commitment of time and money has been made.

Projects might include:

- Pilot Parks & Plazas
- Pilot Bike Lanes/Tracks
- Temporary Structures
- Pop-up Retail/Dining
- Car/Bike/Ride Sharing
- Food Trucks
- Farmers Markets
- Open Streets
- Pedestrian Improvements

Not every pilot project needs to be a physical change. K2 will also identify key zoning, policy, and management adjustments for immediate impact. Pairing these with urban design sets your community up for success.
